

# Farm to Fork Strategy (May 2020)



"Better animal welfare improves animal health and food quality, reduces the need for medication and can help preserve biodiversity."

- "The Commission will revise the animal welfare legislation, including on animal transport and the slaughter of animals, to align it with the latest scientific evidence, broaden its scope, make it easier to enforce and ultimately ensure a higher level of animal welfare."
- "The Commission will also consider options for animal welfare labelling to better transmit value through the food chain."

# European Citizens Initiative 'End the Cage Age'

"The Commission intends to propose to phase out and finally prohibit the use of such cage systems, for all the species and categories referred to in the ECI, under conditions (including the length of the transition period) to be determined based on EFSA opinions, an impact assessment and a public consultation."



1,4 million signatures in all EU Member States Legislation to prohibit the use of cages for:


laying hens, rabbits, pullets, broiler breeders, layer breeders, quail, ducks, geese, sows and calves.



### Revision of EU animal welfare legislation


- Proposals 2023 on updated current EU law + new rules e.g. on dairy cows + empowerments for future rules on other species + possibly animal welfare labelling
- If co-legislators agree: Future specific requirements (to be developed by tertiary legislation) based on Roadmap agreed with EFSA

# Ongoing main EFSA mandates on animal welfare

Mandate*	Agreed deadline
Broilers**	December 2022
Laying hens**	December 2022
Calves	March 2023
Ducks, geese, quail	March 2023
Dairy cows	March 2023

<sup>\*</sup> Mandates for pigs, transport of various species, rabbits and for slaughter are already available.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Also addressing broiler breeders, pullets and layer breeders.

1 EFSA opinion on the welfare of pigs at farm published in August 2022


5 EFSA opinions on the welfare during transport published in September 2022:


ADDRESS SOCIETAL DEMANDS

- Scientific and technological developments are not fully reflected in current rules
- Sub-optimal level of welfare of animals in the EU in particular where targeted legislation is lacking
- Differences in application and enforcement across the EU, partly due to the vagueness of certain provisions

European

- Robust indicators for monitoring and triggering improvements in animal welfare are missing
- Increasing societal expectations and ethical concern


### Impact Assessment: ongoing



- Inception Impact Assessment published on 06/07/2021 (possible future policy options).
- Feedback largely supports the initiative.
- Public Consultation (ended 21/01/2022):
   Almost 60 000 contributions, from across the world!
- In 2022: External studies to support the impact assessment.
- Package of legislative proposals by the end of 2023.


