


 Survey among Equestrian community (almost 28,000 respondents)






Public Survey: The Public respondents – where do they reside?








How concerned are the Public?




The equestrian survey respondents – who are they?


The Equestrian survey - Respondents Where do they reside?




Equestrians: who is concerned?








How do the public feel about the future of the involvement of horses in sport?






